N for neighbors, and November, nice things, new things to remember.

K for kitchen, kettles' croon, kith and kin expected soon.

 $oldsymbol{S}$ for sizzles, sights, and sounds, and something special that abounds.

Cinquains have five lines

Line 1: Title (noun) - 1 word Line 2: Description - 2 words

Line 3: Action - 3 words

Line 4: Feeling (phrase) - 4 words

Line 5: Title (synonym for the title) - 1 word

Special day Thankful, happy People we love gather

Praying, laughing, talking, tasting

Then pie.

Diamante

The Diamante is a form similar to the Cinquain. The text forms the shape of a diamond.

Line 1: Noun or subject - one word

Line 2: Two Adjectives that describe line 1

Line 3: Three 'ing' words that describe line 1

Line 4: Four nouns - (the first two are connected with line 1; the last two are connected with line 7)

Line 5: Three 'ing' words that describe line 7

Line 6: Two adjectives that describe line 7

Line 7: Noun Synonym for the subject

Example: Autumn
Cool, windy
Playing, learning, laughing
Pumpkins, hayrides, bonfires, apples
Shivering, trick-or-treating, snuggling
Spooky, fun
